目録刊行にあたって

本学では、1985年の創立100周年を記念する時期に相前後して、いくつかの重要なコレクションを購入し、図書館の充実に努めてまいりました。デイヴィッド・ヒュームおよび18世紀英国思想文献やトマス・ハーディの著作コレクションなどがその代表的なものですが、それらに加え、1985年度から86年度にかけてイギリスの法思想家ジェレミー・ベンサムの著作コレクションを購入してまいりました。これにその後、追加購入された諸著作を合せますと、本学にも相当数のベンサムの著作が所蔵されたことになります。それらの中には、大英図書館以外では見出されえないものなど、きわめて貴重なものも含まれていると聞いております。ベンサムは近代イギリスを代表する最大の法思想家の一人であり、中央大学が英吉利法律学校として設立された経緯を考え合せますと、本コレクションは本学の伝統にも、また、そうした伝統のうえに教育・研究水準の面で質的な発展を遂げようとする本学の第二世紀への歩みにも、ふさわしいコレクションと言うことができましょう。

本学図書館では、こうした貴重なコレクションについて、それぞれ何らかの形で目録を作成し内外に公表してきております。ベンサム・コレクションにつきましても、過去3年の歳月を費して、ここに目録を刊行する運びとなりましたことは私どもの大きな喜びであります。

ベンサムの著作はそれぞれが複雑な成立事情をもっていると聞いております。本目録は中央大学図書館の蔵書を基本にすえながら、ベンサムの著作を所蔵する主要なイギリスの図書館、すなわち、大英図書館、オックスフォード大学ボードリアン図書館、ユニバーシティ・カレッジ・ロンドン図書館等における調査をふまえ、それら各図書館所蔵のすべての版本を比較照合したうえで作成されております。その意味で、本目録は、ベンサムの著作目録として他に類

を見ないものとなっており、中央大学図書館の誇るべき成果の一つと申せま しょう。

目録の作成には、経済学部池田貞夫教授、経済学部音無通宏助教授、法学部 重森臣広兼任講師に当っていただきました。本学図書館がベンサム・コレク ションを購入するさいに払われた前図書館長中田易直教授ならびに関係各位の 熱意と努力に対して敬意を表するとともに、目録作成に当られた教員とこれを 支えた図書館職員、この間タイプ原稿の作成その他の過重とも思われる仕事を 担当していただいたアルバイターの鈴木恵子さんに対して深い感謝の意を表し たいと思います。

PREFACE

During the four years from 1985 to 1988 Chuo University Library has been unusually fortunate in its acquisition of early editions of Bentham's works. In 1985 a collection of 54 volumes, including sixteen from the library of Sir Francis Burdett (1770–1844), the leading nineteenth-century radical parliamentarian, was added to those already in the Library. Significant additions were made in the following years, the most exciting of which was a copy of the true first edition of *Panopticon* printed in Dublin, and nine items from the library of Edward Livingston (1764–1836), an American legislator and disciple of Bentham. Thus Chuo University Library has undoutedly become one of the most outstanding libraries for its possession of Bentham's works.

We undertook to examine and make a report on the collection shortly after it had become the property of the Library. In order to solve the historical, textual and bibliographical questions we were confronted with in this undertaking, we carried out researches at University College, London, the British Library and the Bodleian Library, Oxford, and at the same time we expanded the scope of our research to all of Bentham's writings printed in English plus Dumont's French versions.

There are certain peculiarities in the method of Bentham's literary work, which must be kept in view in relation to the appearance which his works present. Bentham was a prolific author, but he was without the literary vanity or the desire for completion which may prompt premature publication. After writing his first books he devoted his main effort to the production of a huge mass of manuscripts. As we can see from the tables inserted in some of his books, he began by forming a complete logical scheme for the treatment of any subject, dividing and subdividing so as to secure an exhaustive classification of the whole matter under discussion. Then taking up any subdivision, he set down his thoughts on sheets, which were put aside after being marked with references indicating their place in the final treatise. He never turned to these again. The task of putting the uncoordinated statements in order was left to his disciples. As, however, he would frequently compose on the same subject

at different periods and with different views, and as each fragment was without reference to the others, the task of ultimate combination and adaption was often very perplexing.² Bentham was widely and highly regarded first on the Continent by Dumont's *Traités de législation civile et pénale*, which were based partly on his *Introduction to the principles of morals and legislation* and partly on the manuscript corresponding to unfinished parts of his general scheme. It was by this curious detour that Bentham was able to exercise any influence on his countrymen. Dumont produced several successors to the *Traités* based on other parts of the manuscript, and these were translated or retranslated later for the English edition by other disciples. Together with works produced directly from the manuscript in English by his followers, this material forms an important part of the works on which Bentham's fame rests.

Some of his practical or constructive works were prepared for the press by himself. He also wrote many polemical tracts on current topics. But the publication did not always go smoothly. Bentham often sent to the printer a half-finished manuscript. Some of the manuscripts were hastily completed, but others were suspended. It was not seldom that he changed his plan, rewriting, replacing or adding chapters and paragraphs, on the way to or even after printing. Some papers were distributed only privately. Bentham would take occasion to publish some of them as a part of a larger book or with the preface, and if necessary, adding the appendix. The preface and the appendix often became larger than the main body of the text. In any case, most of his writings were published in an almost casual and haphazard way; sometimes the sheets of paper printed at different times were bound together in one volume. Bibliographical problems we met in our undertaking arose from these circumstances.

The Works of Jeremy Bentham, published between the years 1838 and 1843 under the superintendence of his executor, John Bowring, were not complete, for Bowring not only refused to reprint Bentham's attacks on religion and overlooked some other lesser writings, but also neglected much of the manuscript material bequeathed to him by Bentham. Moreover, this edition contains material of very different status. No consistent or uniform method, as Muirhead writes,³ seems to have been adopted in preparing the matter for this

edition, and although a useful note was in some cases prefaced to a work, in general the opportunity for giving bibliographical information was overlooked. Sometimes the original title is reproduced, sometimes not. In any case, the incompleteness of the Bowring edition is the reason for possessing the original editions and for sorting out their bibliographical history.

The following is a report on our investigation of the editions of Bentham's works. Descriptions given here are based on the copies in possession of the Chuo University Library, University College, London, the British Library and the Bodleian Library, Oxford. In some cases we supplemented them with the descriptions of the Goldsmith Library copies. It includes descriptions of the Dumont's publications and some French translations contained in the Euvres de J. Bentham (Brussels, 1829–30; 3rd enlarged ed., 1840) as well as the editions hitherto published in English. There are several editions entered in Everett's Bibliography and other library catalogues, but not possessed by the libraries above. They are not listed here. On the other hand, we added the description of some utilitarian literature in our Bentham collection. Although the range of our investigation was limited, we endeavoured to provide for most of Bentham's works an account more detailed and precise than that given in Everett's Bibliography.

In our investigation we have enjoyed assistance from the staff of the libraries above. Our special thanks are due to the staff of the Manuscripts and Rare Books Reading Room of University College, London, who provided every convenience possible for us. Our thanks are also due to Mr. Tetsuo Okoshi of the Chuo University Library and to Mr. Hiroshi Tanaka of Chuo University Press. Mrs. Keiko Suzuki deserves our most grateful thanks for her generous assistance over the years.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

- 1. The title-page of the books published before 1838 is transcribed exactly and in full. The upright strokes represent line-ends. The ornament is recorded in square brackets: [orn.]. The printer's line printed across the page is recorded similarly: [rule], [swelled rule], etc.
- 2. The format is stated in abbreviated forms:

Ouarto=4° Octavo=8° Duodecimo=12°

3. The formura shows how the book was — or ideally should have been — constructed. The 23-letter Latin alphabet, or an uninterrupted series of numerals, is used for signing the order of the gatherings of the sheets into a book: the notation A-Z refers to 23 gatherings signed in alphabetical order from A to Z, less I or J, U or V, and W; similarly with a-z; while 1-10 indicates 10 gatherings signed with the numerals 1 to 10. Aa, Aaa, etc. are written 2A, 3A, etc.

A-Z⁴ represents 23 gatherings each of 4 leaves.

If a book has an unsigned initial gathering, but the second is signed B, the third C, and so on, the first gathering is recorded by the signature in brackets: [A]. But if the unsigned sheets or leaves are additional to regular signature series, they are given the simbols π for preliminary gatherings and leaves, and χ for additions elsewhere.

Recto and verso are differentiated as 'a' and 'b'. Thus the recto of the second leaf in the third gathering is referred to as $C2^{\bullet}$ or $3/2^{\bullet}$. ($\pm D3$) indicates that D3 is a corrected leaf, or 'cancel' or 'cancellans'.

The Bowring edition of Bentham's works was first published between 1838 and 1843 in 22 separate parts, and was reissued in 1843 bound into 11 volumes. The volume number had been previously printed at the bottom of the first leaf of each sheet. The date of publication and the contents of each part are as follows. During this period Bentham also drafted the table of contents of the Penal Code which would be a part of Pannomion. It was printed in July and appeared as the second table in the Constitutional Code. The copies of the Code were distributed to various politically influential persons. A copy in the Chuo University Library (Chuo [17]) has a presentation-inscription in Bentham's hand dated 22 February 1830, and hence it seems to have been one of the copies distributed before the publication. The Preface to this book was 'hastily drafted' and printed just before the publication in April 1830.

In his lifetime no other edition was published, but the following extracts: Ch. The news that the Constitutional Committee had submitted on 21 December 1789 to the National Assembly a draught plan for a new judicial system prompted Bentham to prepare and print in instalments his own Draught of a New Plan for Organisation of the Judicial Establishment in France. Instalments, translated by Dumont, began to appear in the Courier de Province for 22–23 May and continued to do so until May. At the beginning of April he addressed a letter to the President of the National Assembly, and one hundred copies of the parts so far printed in England were sent to Paris through the French minister in London, François Barthélemy (Correspondence, iv, pp. xxiii–xxiv and 124 n.).

Panopticon was printed in Dublin and London in 1791. Both editions appear to have been privately circulated only. The Dublin edition has not been recorded in any bibliography, although it is known to have been printed.

The edition of the *Panopticon* which is usually described as the first is a three-volume one with the imprint 'DUBLIN, PRINTED: London, Reprinted; ... 1791' on the title-page to the main text. The two *Postscripts* were first printed in London, but the Dublin printing of the main text preceded the London impression. The cause of the complication appears to have been lack of communication between Bentham and Hobart who was supervising the printing of the Irish edition.

On his return from Russia, Bentham first proposed his Panopticon scheme to the Irish Government through Sir John Parnell and Robert Hobart. Parnell asked Bentham to send the MS. copy to Hobart to have it printed. It was decided that the engravings should be made in London under the supervision of the architect William Reveley. The first part of the book was printed in Dublin, but Hobart did not distribute the books. He was waiting for the *Postscripts* and the engravings. Bentham, hearing nothing from Hobart, decided to print the *Postscripts* in London (the second of which was still being written) and then reprint the *Letters* which formed the original text. He still had hopes of presenting the scheme to the Irish Parliament, and sent the finished sheets of the *Postscripts* to Hobart as they were printed. The second *Postscript* was a little delayed, and the London reprint of the *Letters* began while it was still being printed.

Bentham then received six copies of the Dublin edition, and also the startling news that Hobart had not distributed the imperfect books, as Bentham had previously supposed, but that he had continued with the impression of the Irish edition, printing from the sheets of the *Postscripts* as Bentham sent them over from London. The engravings were still delayed in reaching Dublin. Five hundred copies of the Dublin edition were printed, and it is not known whether Bentham received any more than the initial six; in any case, he very soon had no need for them. It is very probable that many copies were pulped, but survived enough for another Dublin publisher, James Moore, to reissue the sheets in 1796 with a new title, 'Management of the Poor', and the full complement of engraved plates.

The history of publishing of the engravings is equally complicated. Altogether there should be three numbered folding engraved plates, one folding table, and one plate in the text of the *Postscript I*, which is folding in the London edition (p. [166]), but which occurs on pp. 276 and 277 in the Dublin setting. Very few copies of either the London or Dublin editions have all the engravings. Of the three surviving copies of the Dublin edition

(BL, UCL and Chuo copies), only the BL and UCL copies have all three plates. The copies of the London edition are in a worse state.

According to Bentham, most of the plates were destroyed in a fire at the printer's before publication and the book appeared without them.¹ The order in which the plates were completed appears to have been I, III, II. The large folding table designed as an index to the work was not printed until the end of August, three months after the publication of the London edition. Only plates II and III are reproduced in the Bowring edition of the Works. (See Letters relating to the Panopticon in Vol. 4 of Correspondence).

¹ Bentham, in a letter to Bowring dated 24th January 1821, writes, 'The Plates referred to in this work were destroyed by a fire at the printer's. An improved plan of construction is shown in a small plate inserted in the work entitled "Pauper Management improved".'

In the Preface, the author describes briefly the history of the principle of Utility, and attaches the value of his pamphlet to Bentham. It seems the pamphlet was written by a member of the circle of Benthamites. Effingham Wilson was one of the publishers of Bentham's works.

First appeared in *The Pamphleteer*, Vol. xxiii, No. xlvi. It was one of the pamphlets written against Bentham's *Defence of Usury*, published as a single work in the same year.

Robert Maugham was the first secretary to the Incorporated Law Society, a solicitor from 1817, and the author of several treatises which obtained a wide popularity. (cf. Stark, i, p. 31, and DNB.)

Thomas Southwood Smith, sanitary reformer, was brought up as a nonconformist and became in his early life a Unitarian minister. In 1812, intending to combine with the preacher's office the practice of medicine, he

entered as a medical student at Edinburgh, and obtained in 1821 the licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians. Medicine thereafter was his chief interest and occupation. He was one of the projectors of the Westminster Review, and wrote for its first number (January 1824) a very favourable and detailed review of Bentham's Chrestomathia, which he edited later for the Bowring edition of the Works. In the same year he contributed an article, 'On the Use of the Dead to the Living', advocating facilities for dissection. He was also a member of the original committee of the 'Useful Knowledge' society, and contributed to its *Penny Cyclopædia* the articles on anatomy, medicine, and physiology. In 1832 he was placed on the central board for inquiry into the condition of factory children. More than once the poor-law commissioners sought his aid in typhus epidemic. In 1839 he was a main founder of the 'Health of Towns Association', and in 1842 he did much to found the 'Metropolitan Association for Improving the Dwelling of the Industrial Classes', which built the first 'model' dwellings, designed to exclude epidemics by due sanitary conditions. He was on the metropolitan sanitary commission (1847) and was appointed in 1848 a medical member of the 'General Board of Health'.

Bentham had by will left his body to Smith, to be the subject of dissection and an anatomical lecture. Smith performed this task at the anatomy school, Webb Street, Mars, Pond, on 9 June 1832, delivering a lecture, of which two editions were published in the same year. It embodied a sketch of Bentham's philosophy and an account of his last moments. (DNB., and footnotes to J 6–1).
