







Opened in 1889, Sakamotocho Park was the first community park in Tokyo. It was designed to create open spaces for providing fresh air and healthy environment adjacent to the Sakamoto Elementary School by prefectural landscape architect Yasuhei Nagaoka.

Unfortunately, the park was lost by fire spawned from the Great Kanto Earthquake in 1923. Soon after, the reconstruction project took place and the park was re-designed by Kiyoshi Inoshita who was the executive director of Park Department in Tokyo. He created 52 community parks in down town Tokyo.

However, the park was once again destroyed by fire when the city was bombed during WWII.

In 2016, it was decided to rebuild the Sakamoto Elementary School, and the park became the temporary site of school. New design of the park was created through workshops, together with children and community. The concept of new park is to create urban nature for children based on the cultural activities since the 17th century.
