- Collection of research materials -

The Institute of Social Sciences acquires, preserves and provides information resources such as books, journals and other materials to promote collaborative research, primarily in politics, law, history, economics, and sociology. We have the basic policy for collecting materials as follows;

- 1. Serials, journals, periodicals (especially foreign journals).
- 2. Newspapers and organs published by political parties, labor organizations, and agricultural organizations.
- 3. Documents and statistical reports of local governments.
- 4. Labor-related materials.
- 5. Materials about Tama area (the western part of Tokyo).
- 6. Statistical reports of foregin countries.

The Institute's library located on the 4th floor in Building 2 holds these collections, along with other institutions' ones. Some foreign journals are available online. All the researchers affiliated the institute are free to use them.

In addition, Chuo University Library has more than 2.3 million volumes of books, journals and other materials. These collections can be searched by <u>OPAC</u> (CHOIS: Chuo Online Information System). It also provides a wide range of useful domestic and international databases including ProQuest, EBSCO, Nexis Uni, Nikkei Telecom as well as e-books and e-journals.
