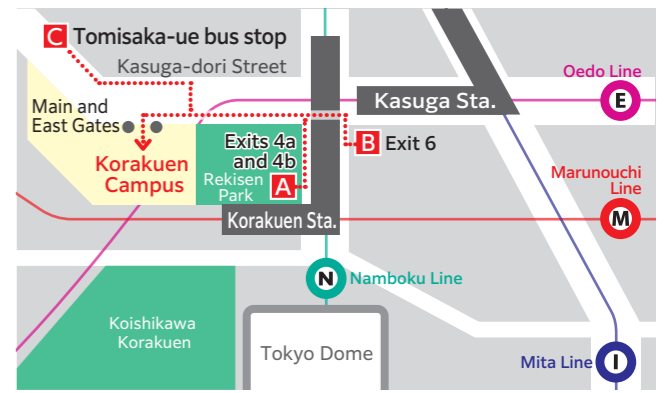

*The number of priority parking spaces is indicated on the map.
 *All entrances and exits to the campus buildings are on the first floor only.
 *Only high school personnel are allowed in the high school areas of Buildings 2, 3, and 8.

Access Route

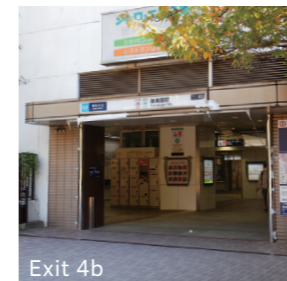
Please use public transportation to get to the campus. Kasuga-dori Street has an uphill slope of approximately 4° from Korakuen Station.

*Contact us in advance if you are coming by car and need priority parking.



Train

A Korakuen Station on the Tokyo Metro Marunouchi Line or Namboku Line to Main Gate and East Gate



Take Exit 4a or 4b, where an elevator is located, and go straight up Kasuga-dori Street for about five minutes.

- Exit 4a**: Stairs with braille blocks.
- Exit 4b**: Flat path with no steps.

B Kasuga Station on the Toei Oedo Line or Mita Line to Main Gate and East Gate



Take Exit 6 (for Bunkyo City Office) and go straight up Kasuga-dori Street for about six minutes. There is an elevator at Exit 6.

Bus

C Toei Bus Tomisaka-ue bus stop (in front of the Faculty of Science and Engineering, Chuo University)

After getting off at the Tomisaka-ue bus stop, you can enter through the main gate on Kasuga-dori Street. When you cross Kasuga-dori Street to get to the bus stop for Kasuga-eki-mae, please use the pedestrian crossing (★) between the Main Gate and the East Gate, as there is less incline. All Toei buses are non-step buses.



Access routes requiring caution

All campus facilities are wheelchair accessible, but some areas require caution.

1 Building 4 (Clubs and Circles)

Please note that although the gates are always open, a 9-cm step surrounds the entrance to the building, and no ramp is provided.



2 Building 6

Although the gates are always open, a 9-cm step surrounds the entrance to the building, and no ramp is provided. Note that there is a groove of approximately 3 cm. Attention is required because a wheelchair may get stuck in the groove, depending on the width of the wheelchair tire.



3 Access route to the 4th-floor arena (Building 5)

The elevators shown on the map do not provide access to the fourth-floor arena. The fourth-floor arena can be accessed from the third floor via the central staircase or wheelchair lift. Contact us in advance if you need to use the wheelchair lift.



4 Library (Building 6)

The library entrance is on the sixth floor of Building 6 and is accessible from the elevator. There is no elevator access inside the library (the fifth through the seventh floors). For wheelchair access inside, contact the sixth-floor counter.
