
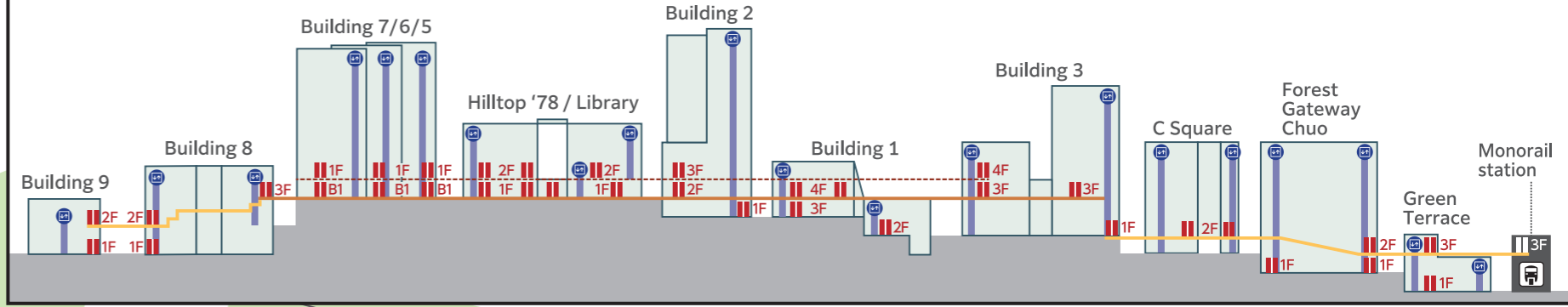


# CHUO UNIVERSITY TAMA CAMPUS BARRIER FREE MAP

(Created: April 2025)

## PEDESTRIAN DECK - SCHOOL BUILDING ACCESS


At Tama Campus, each building is accessible from a two-level pedestrian deck. However, each building has a different entrance and accessible floors. Refer to the map below. The area indicated by the symbol  on the map is located on the pedestrian deck.

All campus facilities are wheelchair accessible. However, be careful in the areas marked with the symbol "⚠️". See the reverse side for details.

\*The number of priority parking spaces in each location is indicated on the map.

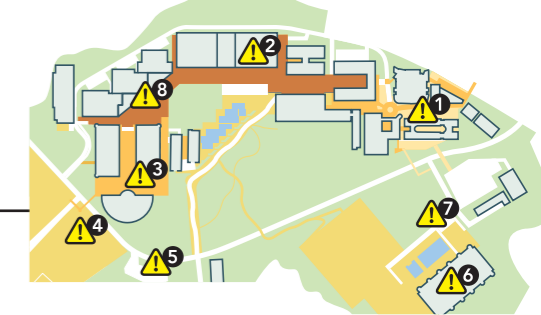
### Access information

- [Building entrance and exit]
-  Recommended for wheelchair users, automatic door
  -  Manual door (hinged door)
- [Roads, ramps, and stairs]
-  Ramp
  -  Rough road
  -  Stairs
  -  Difference in level
  -  Ramp (approx. 3° to 4.5°)  
Wheelchair users can move without assistance.
  -  Slightly steeper ramp (approx. 4.5° to 7°)  
Caregivers should accompany wheelchair users.
  -  Steep ramp (approx. 7° or more)  
Care must be taken when moving, and caregivers must accompany wheelchair users.
- \*Each number indicates the floor with an entrance and exit available.

## ⚠️ Access routes requiring caution

All campus facilities are wheelchair accessible, but some areas require caution.

### ⚠️① Green Terrace Walkway

This area has a steep slope (approx. 6°) and is about 60 meters long, which may be difficult for wheelchair users and some pedestrians.



Steep slope of approx 6° with a length of approx 60 meters

### ⚠️② Central Library

The entrance to the library is on the pedestrian deck. Take the elevator on the passage below the pedestrian deck to the library entrance (2F).



### ⚠️③ Access to Building 9 from the deck

Take the elevator in Building 8 down to the second floor from the passage below the pedestrian deck. Then go down the ramp to the second-floor entrance of Building 9.



### ⚠️④ Passage from the bus stop and main gate to Gymnasium 2

There is a steep slope and differences in level at the edges of the sidewalk, and the path is narrow. Furthermore, there are few streetlights, which may affect using the sidewalk at certain times.



### ⚠️⑤ Bus stop

The place to get on and off the bus is one step higher than the road.



### ⚠️⑥ Gymnasium 1: Access route to the barrier-free restrooms on the first floor

The ramp leading to the restrooms has a slope of approximately 5° to 6°, and wheelchair users should use caution when climbing the ramp.



Ramp angle: Approx. 5° to 6°

### ⚠️⑦ Barrier-free restroom on the 1st floor of Gymnasium 1

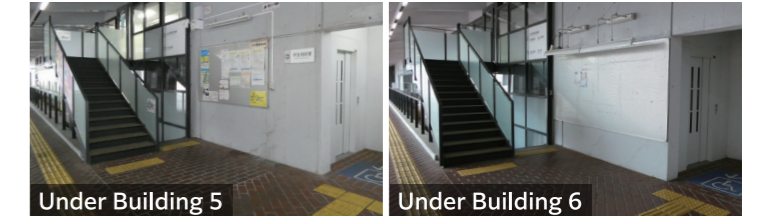
You can use both the downhill ramp and the uphill ramp to access the entrance. (Be careful of the difference in level.)



The ramps are next to the stairs. Pay attention to the difference in level in front of the stairs.

### ⚠️⑧ Under the pedestrian decks of Buildings 5 and 6

The access route to each facility differs. Please see the instructions below.

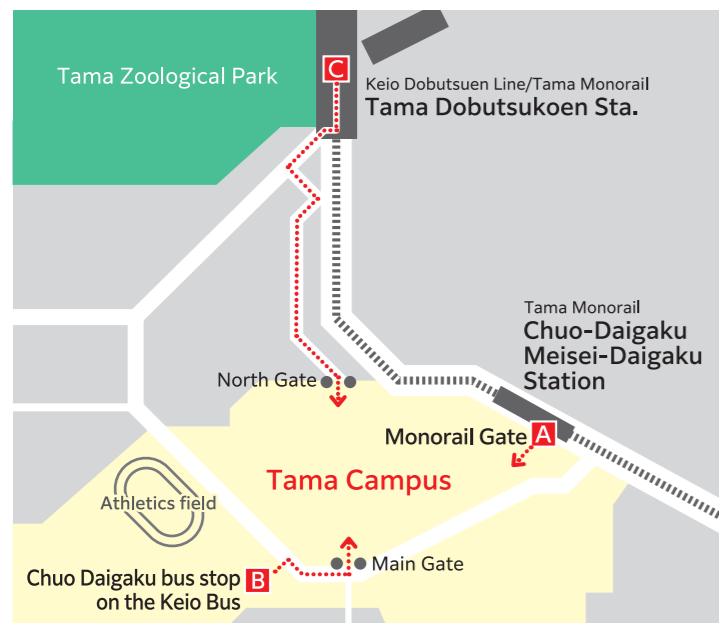
Use the stairs or ramp to go downstairs. ▶ Student Counseling Section/ Volunteer Center

## 📍 Access Route

Please use public transportation to get to the campus. Check the websites of public transportation companies for the latest information.

\*Contact us in advance if you are coming by car and need priority parking.



The following public transportation options are available to visitors to the campus.

**A** The Chuo-Daigaku-Meisei-Daigaku Station on the Tama Toshi Monorail Line is directly connected to Tama Campus and is the recommended route.

### 🚆 Monorail

**A** Tama Monorail [Chuo-Daigaku Meisei-Daigaku Sta.] Monorail Exit

After getting off at Chuo-Daigaku-Meisei-Daigaku Station on the Tama Toshi Monorail Line, you can access the campus directly from the monorail station exit.

\*AEDs are available on the station premises.

### 🚌 Bus

**B** Chuo Daigaku bus stop on the Keio Bus - Main gate

To access the main gate from Tama Center Station, take the bus bound for the Toyoda Eki Minamiguchi (about a 12-minute ride). From JR Toyoda Station, take the bus bound for the Tama-center Station (about a 15-minute ride). Get off at the Chuo University bus stop. \*There is a long slope from the main gate.

### 🚆 Train

**C** Tama Dobutsukoen Sta. on the Keio Dobutsuen Line - North Gate

It takes about 10 minutes on foot from Tama Dobutsukoen Station on the Keio Dobutsuen Line to the North Gate. There are stairs, a level difference, and a steep slope from the North Gate to the campus.
