Thammasat University is Thailand's second oldest university. Officially inaugurated on 27 June 1934 at Tha Phra Chan on the Rattanakosin Island and on the Bank of the Chao Phraya River. The University's founder, Prof. Dr. Pridi Banomyong, originally named Thammasat the "University of Ethics and Politics", reflecting its primary mission to offer higher education in the disciplines of law and politics to the new citizenry and prepare Thai people for their new democratic system.

Hoping to make higher learning accessible to all, Thammasat began as an open university with 7,094 students enrolled in its first academic year.

Since its initial inception, Thammasat University has evolved from an open university for law and politics to a prestigious international research university offering all levels of academic degrees and producing cutting edge research across a broad spectrum of academic disciplines.

The University has graduated more than 300,000 students since its founding who have gone on to make great contributions to the development and progress of Thailand and the world. Notable university alumni include former Prime Ministers, leading politicians and government figures, Bank of Thailand governors, supreme court judges, provincial governors, as well as experts in various fields.

Prof. Dr. Shozaburo SAKAI Chancellor and President, Chuo University

President Sakai was born in 1950 in Miyagi Prefecture. He completed the Chuo University Graduate School of Commerce Doctoral Program and became a professor in the Faculty of Commerce, Chuo University, in 1992. He later became Dean of the Faculty of Commerce and a member of the Board of Regents, as well as a Director of the Organization for Common Education Initiatives. He is now Chancellor and President of Chuo University, a position he has held since



President Sakai was also a Senior Visiting Researcher at the Centre for Russian, and East European Studies(CREES), the University of Birmingham, and a Board Chairperson of the Japan Association for the Comparative Study of Management. He is also currently a Visiting Professor at the University of International Business and Economics in Beijing, a Councilor of the Japanese Economic Association, a Councilor of the Japan Scholarly Association for Asian Management, and an international editor of the Contemporary Asian Economy Research.

Prof. Dr. Somkit LERTPAITHOON Rector, Thammasat University

Prof. Somkit Lertpaithoon is the 16th Rector of Thammasat University and Professor of the Faculty of Law. In 1982 he completed his Bachelor of Law at Thammasat University and then continued his studies in Thailand and France, receiving his Doctor of Law from Paris II in 1990. Prof. Lertpaithoon is an Associate Fellow at the Royal Institute, a position he has held since 2013, and he has been a member of the National Legislative Assembly since 2014.



For his remarkable dedication to education and the field of law, Prof. Lertpaithoon has been awarded various Royal Decorations, including Knight Commander (First Class) of the Most Exalted Order of the White Elephant, Knight Commander (First Class) of the Most Noble Order of the Crown of Thailand, and Companion (Fourth Class) of the Most Admirable Order of the Direkgunabhorn.

Counsellor of the Embassy of Japan in Thailand, Mr. Shigeki KOBAYASHI Director of Japan Information Services

Mr. Kobayashi graduated from the Department of Law, Soka University in 1983. He joined the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1983 and became Attaché of the Embassy of Japan in Thailand in 1984. (Panelist) Prof. Dr. Chikako TAKEISHI Vice President and Director of the International Center, Chuo University



(Panelist) Asst.Prof.Dr.Nitinant WISAWEISUAN


Vice Rector for International Affairs, Thammasat University


(Moderator) Prof. Dr. Stephen HESSE
